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# Prince George's County: Jobs and Economic Development Agenda Message from Angela Alsobrooks, County Executive

Prince George's County has made great progress in economic development over the last several years. As we attract more opportunities and investments to the County, we must make sure our residents are workforce ready with the skills necessary to take advantage of these new jobs.

To accomplish this, our County is going to start investing in workforce development training to supplement what is already offered through state and federal governments. These investments will add new resources to training programs, allowing them to expand and positively impact even more residents. We will also begin more proactive outreach into our communities to ensure everyone who needs these services are given the opportunity to participate.



In addition to investing more in workforce development, my administration is focusing heavily on attracting new economic development to the County. We will work to bring much-needed development to our inner Beltway communities, which will not only alleviate retail concerns but also provide new jobs to those areas. We will work to bring more high-quality retail to the County, including more restaurants and clothing options. Finally, we will work to bring more companies to our County with high-skill tech jobs.

We recently held the ribbon -cutting ceremony for the Aerospace Corporation which just resettled in Prince George's County, and we will let similar companies know that they are also welcome to relocate to the County.

Both workforce development and economic development go hand-in-hand. As we continue to build a skilled workforce in Prince George's, more companies will seek to relocate here. And as more companies relocate, we will grow our commercial tax base and have additional resources to devote to workforce development programs, public education, and much more. Our goal is to continue investing in our residents and our communities to ensure everyone has access to the new opportunities that will continue to come to Prince George's County.

## Maryland Gains 7,900 Jobs in November

State Unemployment Rate Falls to 4.0 Percent

BALTIMORE (Dec. 21, 2018) – According to preliminary survey data, Maryland added 7,900 jobs in November, the eighth month this year to post over-the-month job gains. Compared to this time last year, Maryland jobs are up by 36,700, for an over-the-year increase of 1.3 percent. Maryland's unemployment rate has now fallen to 4.0 percent. "Maryland's strong economy provides a stable foundation for employers to invest in and grow their businesses, creating a need for talent," said Labor Secretary Kelly M. Schulz. "Maryland's workforce development programs meet that need by creating formal career paths to good jobs, reducing barriers to employment, providing occupational skills development, and so much more. These innovative programs work with employers to strategically build and strengthen their talent pipeline, ensuring a ready and capable workforce both now and in the future."
